The Lesson

A reading from Isaiah (25:6—9)

The Holy Bible (NRSV) p. 639

Commentary:

Of all the Old Testament prophets, Isaiah is the most comprehensive in scope. The primary purpose of Isaiah is to display God's glory and holiness through His judgment of sin and His deliverance and blessing of a righteous remnant. In this vision, Isaiah foresees a time when God invites His redeemed people to celebrate with Him at a great banquet. The Lord promises to remove the curse of death that has hung over humankind since Adam and Eve sinned in the Garden of Eden. Isaiah looks ahead to the time when God's people will rejoice, because they are in the Lord's presence forever.

On this mountain the Lord of hosts will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well-aged wines, of rich food filled with marrow, of well-aged wines strained clear. And he will destroy on this mountain the shroud that is cast over all peoples, the sheet that is spread over all nations; he will swallow up death forever. Then the Lord God will wipe away the tears from all faces, and the disgrace of his people he will take away from all the earth, for the Lord has spoken. It will be said on that day, Lo, this is our God; we have waited for him, so that he might save us. This is the Lord for whom we have waited; let us be glad and rejoice in his salvation.


