

The Collect of the Day (remain standing)

Almighty and everliving God, in your tender love for the human race you sent your Son our Savior Jesus Christ to take upon him our nature, and to suffer death upon the cross, giving us the example of his great humility: mercifully grant that we may walk in the way of his suffering, and also share in his resurrection; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Commentary:

This is the third of four Servant Songs in Isaiah, songs that spoke to the circumstances of the prophet's original audience while also looking ahead to the work of the ultimate Servant, Jesus Christ. Words had come to the Servant through His daily, direct interaction with the Sovereign Lord. God had given His Servant the desire and ability to hear and to respond obediently to what He heard. The Servant willingly suffered abuse and disdain for His obedience to God but He did not turn back. The Servant relied on God to vindicate Him for His faithfulness to His calling; He suffered not because of His guilt but in spite of His innocence. Through it all, the Servant steadfastly continued to model trust in God.

The Lord God has given me the tongue of a teacher, that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word. Morning by morning he wakens — wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught. The Lord God has opened my ear, and I was not rebellious, I did not turn backward. I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard; I did not hide my face from insult and spitting. The Lord God helps me; therefore I have not been disgraced; therefore I have set my face like flint, and I know that I shall not be put to shame; he who vindicates me is near. Who will contend with me? Let us stand up together. Who are my adversaries? Let them confront me. It is the Lord God who helps me; who will declare me guilty?

The Second Reading: Philippians 2:5-11


Commentary:

Paul turned to the ultimate example, Jesus Christ, to encourage humility and unity within the Philippian church. Jesus, the Son of God, voluntarily and willingly adopted a manner of existence different from His Father, that of God-man. He chose not to use His powers to lift Himself above ordinary human limitations. Jesus did not lay aside the form of God, He added on the form of a man, of a servant; Jesus appeared to people around Him just as any other man. Jesus was willing to endure death by crucifixion, a means of execution so brutal that Roman citizens were exempt from it. The Son was submissive to the depths of humiliation and God the Father raised Him to the height of exaltation. One day, every knee will bow in recognition of the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross. Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

The Holy Gospel: Luke 19:28-40

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

After telling a parable to the crowd at Jericho, Jesus went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. When he had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, saying, "Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it.'" So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?" They said, "The Lord needs it." Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, saying, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!" Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, order your disciples to stop." He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out."







With the blessing of Bishop Skirving and the full agreement of our St James COVID Taskforce, we are returning this Palm Sunday to the offering of the common cup at our Holy Eucharists. Today will be the first time this has taken place since spring of 2020. Understandably, this transition will be viewed differently by members of our parish family. The offering of wine comes as an invitation, and in no way an expectation. You are encouraged o reflect on what feels appropriate for you and your family. Please know that you are still experiencing the fullness of the sacrament that is Holy Eucharist whether you elect to partake of both elements or only the bread.

Chalice bearers will be present to offer the common cup at all stations. For those who prefer to dip the wafer (intinction), please make sure to sanitize your hands before receiving communion and allow only the wafer to make contact with the wine in the chalice.

Should you prefer to abstain from the cup, when you are approached by the chalice bearer please cross your arms over your chest to signify that you are not partaking of the wine at this time. You will then be acknowledged by the chalice bearer.
