
THE WORD OF GOD

The Lesson: Ephesians 1:11–23

The Holy Bible; NRSV, p. 1066

Commentary: Daniel was exiled to Babylon, caught up in the first of three waves of deportations from Judah. He was probably only a teeneager when he arrived in Babylon, but eventually he attained an official position within the government. Although his homeland had been overrun by foreign powers, Daniel gained the respect of his pagan masters due to his unwavering trust in the sovereignty of Israel's God. This passage describes Daniel's dream of the downfall of world empires. (Details of the dream are recorded in 7:4—14.) The vision baffled and alarmed Daniel, but an angel gave him the interpretation. Kings and kingdoms will rise and fall, but ultimately, God's people will reign with Him forever.

In the first year of King Belshazzar of Babylon, Daniel had a dream and visions of his head as he lay in bed. Then he wrote down the dream: I, Daniel, saw in my vision by night the four winds of heaven stirring up the great sea, and four great beasts came up out of the sea, different from one another. As for me, Daniel, my spirit was troubled within me, and the visions of my head terrified me. I approached one of the attendants to ask him the truth concerning all this. So he said that he would disclose to me the interpretation of the matter: "As for these four great beasts, four kings shall arise out of the earth. But the holy ones of the Most High shall receive the kingdom and possess the kingdom for ever—for ever and ever."



The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.






