



The First Lesson: Acts 2:14a,22-32

Commentary: On Pentecost, Peter, newly indwelt by the Holy Spirit, addressed the assembled crowd in Jerusalem. In this part of his speech, Peter cited two proofs that Jesus was the Messiah: His miracles and His resurrection. Jesus' miracles bore witness to the fact that God had empowered Him and His ministry. Peter pointed out that Jesus' crucifixion had been no accident but was part of God's eternal plan. It was impossible for death to hold Jesus because He had committed no sin. Jesus had not personally earned the wages of sin, but He voluntarily took upon Himself the sins of others. Peter referred to Psalm 16 as Old Testament prophecy of Jesus' resurrection.

Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd, "You that are Israelites, listen to what I have to say: Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with deeds of power, wonders, and signs that God did through him among you, as you yourselves know— this man, handed over to you according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of those outside the law. But God raised him up, having freed him from death, because it was impossible for him to be held in its power. For David says concerning him, 'I saw the Lord always before me, for he is at my right hand so that I will not be shaken; therefore my heart was glad, and my tongue rejoiced; moreover my flesh will live in hope. For you will not abandon my soul to Hades, or let your Holy One experience corruption. You have made known to me the ways of life; you will make me full of gladness with your presence.' "Fellow Israelites, I may say to you confidently of our ancestor David that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us to this day. Since he was a prophet, he knew that God had sworn with an oath to him that he would put one of his descendants on his throne. Foreseeing this, David spoke of the resurrection of the Messiah, saying, 'He was not abandoned to Hades, nor did his flesh experience corruption.' This Jesus God raised up, and of that all of us are witnesses."

The Epistle: 1 Peter 1:3–9

Commentary: This epistle is only 105 verses long, but it is a microcosm of Christian faith and duty. It was written to Gentile Christians living in the Roman province of Asia Minor. Peter wrote to encourage his readers, who were facing persecution for their faith, to stand firm (see 1 Peter 5:12). In this passage, Peter called on his readers to praise God for their salvation, which cannot be destroyed by any enemy, or stained by evil, or decayed by time. Peter reminded the people that present troubles were temporary and brief, but eternal joy lay ahead. Besides that, believers could experience joy now because even in trials, they have hope, faith and love.

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By his great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, who are being protected by the power of God through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. In this you rejoice, even if now for a little while you have had to suffer various trials, so that the genuineness of your faith-being more precious than gold that, though perishable, is tested by fire-may be found to result in praise and glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed. Although you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy, for you are receiving the outcome of your faith, the salvation of your souls.

The Holy Gospel: John 20:19–31

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John. People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you.' After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe." A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name."







ST. JAMES YOUTH OUTREACH WORSHIP IN ACTION

Several exciting and wonderful experiences await our St. James young people, their friends and adults who accompany our young people on their journeys of faith. This summer many of our young people will be serving God through Outreach & Mission.

During 2023 - 2024, our young people and adults will be participating in Outreach Opportunities and Projects within Wilmington & in other places within our world. Already we have collected over 300 stuffed animals to give to children who will benefit having a snuggly stuffed toy nestled up next to them.

"Glory Ridge" in Madison County will be our week long outreach opportunity where we will repair homes, begin to build a home for one of the families for whom we have worked whose home burned to the ground a little over a month ago.

In July, fifteen of us will fly to Ecuador to repair, build, share, learn and worship with our new Ecuadorian friends and we will learn about their history and culture. Historically, St. James has been a leader in helping people who have need that can be met by our gifts and talents.

During the coming year, our youth will be experiencing Episcopal worship in a variety of traditions and cultures, providing Bible School for children, and renovating and building homes, schools, and churches. As a result of our activities we hope to come away with a keener sense of God at work in us both here in Wilmington and in the world.
