### THE GOLDEN HALO

Cue one shining moment as the madness is over! The Golden Halo has been awarded to 2021 Lent Madness winner Absalom Jones! If you participated in Lent Madness or used the material included in the St. James Lent-in-a-Box you would see the amazing journey Absalom Jones took to the Golden Halo. Jones was the lowest seed in his region and through a series of major upsets won the entire tournament.

Some of you might be asking, who is Absalom Jones? Jones was the first African-American Episcopal Priest. He was born in 1746 in Delaware. He attended a Quaker school in Philadelphia. He purchased his wife's freedom from slavery and his own in 1784. Jones served as lay reader at St. George's Methodist Episcopal Church and helped increase the membership until the leadership wanted African-Americans to be restricted to the gallery. They all walked out of the church.

Absalom Jones helped organize the Free African Society which began building their own church, free of seating restrictions in 1792. The church then applied to become members of The Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Pennsylvania. Jones and the church leadership asked that they be received as an organized body, have control over

their own church affairs, and finally that Absalom Jones be licensed as a lay-reader and if qualified to be ordained. The Diocese of Pennsylvania agreed and in 1794 St. Thomas African Episcopal Church became official.

Bishop William White, the second bishop in the Episcopal Church and the first Presiding Bishop, ordained Absalom Jones a deacon in 1795 and a priest in 1802. Absalom Jones was anti-slavery and advocated for the abolishment of slavery and against fugitive slave bills. The church grew rapidly under his leadership and is still a large active church in Philadelphia today.

Absalom Jones deserved to win the Golden Halo. Miriam McKenny wrote about Jones in the Faithful Four, "Absalom Jones shows us what it looks like to be a Christian, a community organizer, a faith leader, and a friend. That's what Absalom Jones has to do with you: he shows you how to follow Jesus, no matter what." Absalom Jones faced a myriad of obstacles in his life but he still welcomed all into the church after he had been turned away. He was a forerunner and his impact has lasted over 200 years after his death in 1818. His preaching was powerful and prophetic. May we all remember him, honor him, and celebrate his ministry.

"Let the first of January, the day of the abolition of the slave trade in our country, be set apart in every year, as a day of public thanksgiving for that mercy. Let the history of the sufferings of our brethren, and of their deliverance, descend by this means to our children, to the remotest generations; and when they shall ask, in time to come, saying, What mean the lessons, the psalms, the prayers and the praises in the worship of this day? Let us answer them, by saying, the Lord, on the day of which this is the anniversary, abolished the trade which dragged your fathers from their native country, and sold them as bondmen in the United States of America."

## STRATEGIC PLAN UPDATE- STRATEGY #4

**Strategy #4 – Challenge all members to increase financial support for St. James Parish.**

The Strategic Plan for St. James Parish begins with a strength – fulfillment of our historic mission and of our true potential – and ends with a problem – St. James is underfunded. To address both, this strategy begins and ends in “generosity.”

In our study, the Strategic Planning Group (SPG) found our operating budget to be surprisingly small, chiefly because only a quarter of our 1200 members (800 “giving units”) pledge annually to support it. A church of our size, history, and importance cannot fulfill its mission without proper funding. And so the SPG has urged – and the Vestry has already adopted – that by 2023 we support an annual budget of \$2.2M (almost twice its current size); raise \$7M in capital gifts; increase annually the number of pledges, \$5000 gifts, and planned gifts; and personalize our stewardship efforts.

The Strategic Plan calls for ambitious enhancements of:

- Salaries
- Outreach (to both our members and the Wilmington community)
- Music
- Evangelism (in welcome to others)
- Christian Formation (for example, an expanded Speakers’ Series)
- Proper maintenance of the SJP facility

To explain the church’s needs and to solicit generous support for meeting them, the SPG has recommended to the Vestry:

- Decentralization and personalization of the solicitation process
- A well-organized Stewardship Committee
- A well-trained Canvassing Committee
- Effective use of technology

As with all aspects of the Strategic Plan our goal is excellence: “Anything worth doing is worth doing well.” And excellence has its costs.

## **SPIRITUAL GROWTH MOMENT: A SEASON OF REPENTANCE**

This season of Lent has been different for me—and for others—for many reasons. It initially came in a box! Thankfully for improving metrics some traditional, albeit socially distanced, services were able to be incorporated. As Lent began I read that one shouldn't view it as finding something to give up, but gaining through this period of inward reflection and repentance.

I came to realize that to receive the transformative benefits of this period I would need to more fully understand and engage in the process of repentance. I say process because the common misconception of the word holds that one might feel guilty about an act or omission, say sorry, and then believe that grace has restored us without any further action. Part of this stems from our weekly recitation of the Confession of Sin. We confess, we are sorry, we humbly repent, we then go forth to walk in His ways. While this is a quick and spiritually refreshing process at church, the lengthier process of repentance (which leads to walking in His ways) involves work, sometimes hard work. As coincidences go I was participating in the most recent session of Sacred Ground (well worth your time!) and read an excerpt from Jim Wallis' book *America's Original Sin*. In it he speaks of repentance as meaning "literally to stop, make a radical turnaround, and take an entirely new path. It means a change of mind and heart and is demonstrated by nothing less than transformed behavior."

As coincidences go—again—my wife Michelle and I had chosen to give up something together for Lent. We had never done this before, but for the sake of our relationship we were ready to put in the work to make a radical turnaround. Having declared my repentance, it is now incumbent on me to continually demonstrate my repentance by nothing less than transformed behavior.

### **ST. JAMES' NEW ROOF**

*Work Begins April 12, 2021*

St. James' Church building, a Gothic Revival structure designed by Thomas U. Walter, was built in 1839. You may be surprised to learn that the current roof is original to the building. After almost 200 years of storms, wear, and general aging, it is clear that a new roof is needed.

A project of this scope takes a team. With the help of Highland Roofing and Architect Ian Johnston, AIA, St. James will soon have a brand new roof that maintains the historical appeal. Construction will begin on April 12, 2021. Our community can expect to see scaffolding along the perimeter of the Church building, including those areas in the St. Francis Memorial Garden along the Church walls.

The project will last well into the summer and occupy the central lawn between the church and Bacon House. Everyone involved with the project is committed to a safe environment that will allow church services to continue inside St. James throughout the construction period.
