### A LETTER

Dear Friends,

Most of us trust God with our life, which is to say, we trust God to protect us, strengthen us, empower us, and sustain us. We trust God to keep the good times rolling and generally keep things rosy. The message the Church proclaims during the season of Easter revises these expectations. Resurrection begins by trusting God for something completely different. Paradoxically, Easter is about trusting God with your death. Yes, *your* death. Emily Dickinson begins one of her poems with this probing line: “We will die, but that is *all* we will do for death. Until then, I can trust my death to God as a way to enter the mystery of Easter.”

Another paradox Saint Paul makes clear, “We live because we are free to die.” We are free by God’s love to take death down to its own size and squeeze what’s left

of its fearful power out of our lives: “Oh death, where art thy sting?” Easter confronts our deep-seated fear and denial of the power of death; indeed, the reign of death, as well it should, with the declaration that the worst has already been known in our lives—the deaths we have known and the deaths of our normalcy we are dying now.

In some ways, the whole Christian life is a preparation for death’s undoing. It is a journey taken in the confidence of God to transcend it. It is the crafting of a life that can let go when the end comes because it has been completely lived, regardless of how long a life it has spanned. The one true freedom in life, is to come to terms with death, and as early as possible. Death knocks on our doors, tempting us to outwit, outflank, outmaneuver it. But the only way we die, and do only that for death, is to lead a life that is good for the whole human family. Lead a good one, full of curiosity, imagination, innovation, compassion, wisdom, and generosity so there will be no need, at the close of the day, to rage against the flickering of our final lights sending us gently into that good night. God holds us in our life as well as in our deaths. With each victory over death, God welcomes us home to Easter’s provenance where all true joys are to be found. The more we do God’s will, the least unfinished business we will leave behind when we die. Until then, eternal life is not a possession conferred at death...it is a present endowment.

If I'm being honest, then I have to admit that, when first faced with the lifestyle changes that came along with the coronavirus, I was frustrated. Although there was some good such as having all three of our children home at one time, I initially was focused on the fear of the virus and the constant disappointments that came along with its dramatic impact on our daily lives. Weddings cancelled, plans with friends changed, and, most importantly, the reality that my high school senior's graduation ceremony would not take place as planned. It seemed like every day I was faced with a new loss or disappointment that something would be different than I had expected. Connection points such as church services, meetings, and even going to the gym were no longer allowed. Even the day-to-day routines such as going to the grocery store had a completely different feel.

Interestingly though, what started as a challenge now seems to be a gift. As we settled into a much slower paced and simpler lifestyle, much of the clutter of our typical everyday life was cleared away, and we were given time to reflect on what matters most. I found myself with the ability to be more intentional about how I spent my time each day. Like many, I have had a lot of wonderful, unexpected time with family. I have seen more of my neighbors and had time to call and catch up with old friends. I also have found myself more fully able to dive into the season of Lent with new spiritual practices and prayer and begin some of my temporarily forgotten New Years resolutions. I have gained new perspective as I watch so many struggle in so many ways both economically and health-wise and appreciate a few things I may have even recently taken for granted. Like some of the best gifts, this time is not something for which I ever would have asked but something that I realize that I really could use.

One day (hopefully soon), this time of isolation will end. The real question is what happens then? How do we hold on to new practices and perspectives as we get back to our "normal" life. We asked our kids the other night what the first thing they would do when the restrictions were lifted, and let's just say that their first responses did not involve more time with Mom and Dad! As we talked further though, we all agreed that there were many positives and that they had broadened their appreciation for many things. I feel much the same and want to make sure that I don't lose sight of some of the things I have enjoyed most in living in a simpler way. During what is hopefully just a few more weeks of time at home, maybe we all can spend some time thinking about what new habits, practices, and perspectives we will maintain. Hopefully, when "normal" life resumes and the next chapter begins, we, our community, and our world all are changed for the better.
