### STATE OF ST. JAMES PARISH FINANCES IN LIGHT OF COVID-19

As I sat down to write this update on church finances, I could not help but think back upon the history of St. James Parish; a history which notably includes a few pandemics, a spattering of wars, several economic collapses, and a whole host of concerning natural disasters and world events. Through it all, St. James has persevered and when the challenge at hand has come to pass, parishioners have once again gathered to worship at the corner of Third & Market. Covid-19 will be no different and, like MacArthur, "We Shall Return"! In the interim, we can all consider ourselves fortunate to have such wonderful staff and clergy at St. James. They have adapted quickly and without interruption; feeding our collective spiritual needs via modern technology, streaming church services, and Sunday school gatherings hosted via Zoom. I can't help but to think how far we have come since Yellow Fever in 1862 or Spanish Flu in 1918 and what it must have been like for St. James parishioners during those pandemics, completely cut off from one another, the church, and the outside world, in the midst of widespread disease and mortality. Given this context, we are blessed indeed and have much to be thankful for!

In furtherance of that perspective, I am pleased to report that St. James remains on sound financial footing, which has allowed us to retain our staff and keep St. James operating and offering its ministries during this period. Year to date, we have received pledge income of \$471,634 coupled with other revenue sources totaling \$74,583, while our expenses continue to track slightly under budget. Overall, we are tracking ahead on revenues and below budget on expenses YTD. However, we have another eight months left to go in 2020 and need your continued support. We are still approximately \$50,000 short of our 2020 pledge goal. If you have not made a pledge, please do so as you are able. Additionally, despite wonderful technology, we have not yet figured out how to physically pass the offering plate online, and thus have only collected \$4,217 of our \$30,000 annual budget for Plate Offering. If you support the church via the offering plate, please consider sending an offering to Saint James via online or mail. Information to give online is on the next page of the Grapevine. If you made a 2020 pledge, please continue to fulfill it by making regular payments as you are able. We are appreciative of your continued stewardship and support.

Lastly, St. James is here for you. If Covid-19 has left you out of work or otherwise interrupted your finances and you are in need of assistance, financial or otherwise, please consider reaching out to a member of clergy and letting them know. These conversations will be guarded in the strictest of confidence and clergy are more than happy to offer support or otherwise assist you through these challenging times. You can count on St. James and your church family.

## **SPIRITUAL GROWTH MOMENT**

“Let go and let God.” That was a phrase I heard a lot as a younger Christian. To me, it always seemed a bit trite. It seemed like questionable advice that didn’t take into account my ability to handle things. It certainly seemed like an impossible thing to do.

So, it is ironic that this simple admonition reflects what has probably been the primary arena of my spiritual growth over the past couple of years.

I have been learning to let go of control. I have been learning to let go of wanting to be in control. I have been learning that I am not, and never will be, ultimately in control. I have been learning in ever deeper ways that God is indeed in control – and that God truly can be trusted.

I have found that God’s timing is better than my timing. I am seeing that God’s plan is better than my plan, although that has not kept me from formulating all sorts of plans for God – this learning is all still very much a work in process.

And yet, it has all been quite real. There have been specific occasions in my family life, my professional life, and in my life at St. James when I have sensed God opening doors, pointing to a path, putting just the right person in my path, and inviting me into the flow of his Spirit.

When the wardens first asked to know if any of us would like to serve on the Search Committee for our next rector, I felt like saying, Yes. Then I looked at my carefully crafted calendar. My travel schedule clearly precluded serving. Then the pandemic shutdown began. All of Linda’s and my travel through mid-July, some of which had been planned for well over a year, was soon cancelled. As I let go of all those plans, God opened up the possibility of joining the search process, in which I am delighted to take part.

That’s just one small example of how God has been showing me that I can let go of control because he’s in control.

I can’t tell you why or how any of this has happened. I can only say that it has all been a function of pure grace – and a true gift.

## **SHEPHERDING YOUR FLOCK**

### *"Shepherding Your Flock"*

For many years, parents have asked how to talk with their kids about difficult and challenging situations. Now, the question has been modified to how do I help my kids during this time of uncertainty and disappointment. Whether your children are 2 or 22, the rhythm and patterns of their lives have been altered by Coronavirus. Life as they knew it has changed. None of us has the knowledge of what the future holds yet we do know that God holds the future.

Every Saturday, while I was growing up, I asked my parents the same question. "Do we have to go to Church tomorrow?" The response was always "Tomorrow is Sunday, isn't it?" I knew that no rebuttal was going to change our family's destination the next morning. I wish that I could tell you that I was the "model child" sitting in that pew each Sunday or that I was the "perfect child" in my Sunday School Class. I was the kid that was made to go to Church and Sunday School. It was during these times that I was taught "The Lord is my Shepherd....."

Our Shepherd is with us now. A shepherd never leaves his flock and each sheep knows their shepherd's voice. A shepherd leads and also searches for lost sheep. A shepherd tends his flock and cares for their needs. As parents and as the Body of Christ known as "The Church" we must take time during our "social distancing" to listen to one another and to recognize the Presence of Jesus, our Shepherd, among us. So, here are a few suggestions:

- Gather as a family each day and light a candle to signify that this time is "different."
- Have each person share their "Low" of the day: the time that they wondered if God was truly there or when they felt sad, afraid or troubled by what was happening in the world or in their life.
- Share the "High" of their day: something that happened during the day that made them "happy" or filled them with "joy."
- Share where they experienced God's Presence. It might have been the beauty of a sunset, a conversation with a friend, someone recovering from Covid-19, a peaceful walk outside, singing a song, etc.
- Prayer Requests and Thanksgivings - share concerns, situations, people who are in need, Medical Personal, thankful for the sun or a long walk, etc.

As I look back on my childhood, I am thankful for the seeds of faith, love and understanding that were sown. As I faced defeat, rejection, sadness, pain and death, I had been taught that God would accompany me. As I achieved my goals and tasted success, I had been taught that God had guided me. When my son was badly injured, The Community of Faith known as "the Church" surrounded our family and carried us when we were frightened and exhausted. My parents had immersed me in FAITH and they taught me that God was always with me! Psalm 23 still resides within me.

During this time of limited activities and socializing, why not take some time to hear the "Whisper of God." I don't know about you but I feel better when people listen to me and when I can share my thoughts, fears, doubts, thanksgivings and joys. So, during this time of "separation," let's join together as the "Body of Christ" and hear what your family or friends are saying. We just might hear the "Whisper of God's Love."

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## **YOUTH MINISTRIES 2020-2021**

During this time of "social distancing," I have been doing a lot of pondering and creative thinking. As I share each Wednesday morning with our youth Bible Study via Zoom, I have listened and been amazed at their desire to know God more fully and to live authentic lives serving God. The questions that they ask, the "Highs and Lows" of their week and my favorite.... where/when each of them experienced the "Presence of God" during the week....all are holy moments of deep sharing and reflections of our living and loving God! Each day I am inspired to look to the future and to begin to shape our 2020 - 2021 St. James Youth Ministries..... Worship, youth group, Bible Studies, small groups, mission, outreach, creating opportunities for authentic relationships, adult mentors, fun, sabbath. Etc. I would love to hear your ideas, suggestions, and thoughts.
