Dear Friends,

I pray this letter finds you and your loved ones well. My reason for writing you currently is regarding St. James' response to COVID-19.

You may be aware that we currently are not meeting in the church for worship, and by order of the Governor there can be no meetings of greater than 10 people on church property.

Since 1729, St. James has been a place where people have gathered for public worship. We have come together on joyous occasions to celebrate joyous occasions such as baptisms, weddings, for Christmas, Easter, listen to music, for youth events, the list goes on and on. There have been times we have been able to comfort one another and share our grief ... for national disasters like 9/11, when we have gone to war, for funerals. St. James has been a safe place, a special place, a sacred place, and it will continue to be our sacred space. But, since April 2020, we have not been able to gather in that holy place due to COVID restrictions.

Working in these conditions is more work for the parish staff than if we could just open the doors. There is nothing I or the parish staff would like to do more than to worship indoors at St. James.

Being people of hope, we pray that we soon will be able to gather in St. James. There is light at the end of the tunnel. The light is getting brighter every day. Until such time...wear your mask... practice social distancing .... wash your hands and get the vaccine when it is available.
