### PERSEVERANCE

In the last couple of weeks, we have heard quite a bit about Perseverance. Perseverance is more than just doing something despite the difficulty of achieving success. Perseverance sums up what we have been through at St. James, too. A long journey. An unknown moment of time. Joy. Going into the unknown. All of this also is what occurred last week with a rover's trip to Mars. Perseverance is also the name of the newest Mars rover exploring the red planet. Since it landed has made me think about how difficult a journey we can have, but only through the collective action of us all working towards a common goal can we persevere with a concrete landing and begin going to a new place.

The journey of Perseverance has been incredible. First, the engineers had to design a rover that could land with no human assistance due to the sheer distance between Earth and Mars to send signals. The rover had to be resistant to the harsh climate of Mars while being able to carry out multiple scientific experiments. Then NASA had to hope for a successful rocket launch followed by a seven-month journey through space. When the rocket approached Mars and began the descent, there would be seven minutes where no one would know if the landing was successful because it takes so long to send signals between Mars and Earth. Perseverance would enter the atmosphere of Mars, discard the heatshield, find a safe landing zone using onboard computers, deploy a parachute, release the parachute, and a descent vehicle would reverse thrust. At the same time, Perseverance, lowered via cable to the surface of Mars, the descent vehicle would launch itself as far away as possible. Finally, Perseverance would send a signal and photo back to NASA saying it had landed.

Any single moment could have gone wrong and scrapped years of work. Thousands of people had to be pulling in the same direction to make Perseverance a success. What lessons can we learn from Perseverance? We have a strategic plan which I hope everyone reads and digests. When we all pull in the same direction with our own dash of Perseverance to not give up in the face of difficulty, we can do incredible things to expand and deepen the Kingdom of Heaven.

The journey of St. James is very much similar to the Perseverance rover over the last few hundred years. St. James has seen the birth of a new nation, new buildings, generations of people come and go, and yet we still stand strong at Third and Market. There are multiple points throughout the history of St. James where things could have gone awry, but each generation stepped up to persevere through whatever came. We now have another part of the journey of St. James. The big question for us is how we will build on what has come in the past and make it better for the future. How will we be remembered during this part of the journey at Third and Market? Let us persevere and move forward together.

### **STRAGETIC PLAN UPDATE- STRATEGY #1**

### Strategy #1 – Energize the Sunday Morning experience in order to create a more hospitable, diverse, and spiritually enriching experience.

For Christians, worship, especially corporate worship, is fundamental to our faith and to our membership in a church community. For Episcopalians, the traditional worship liturgy is strengthened by the sermon, music, and prayers.

However, we at St. James aspire to something more – an energy that sends us into the world to live and preach the Gospel and to realize the full potential of our church community.

To that end, the Strategic Planning Group has offered recommendations in these areas to the Vestry:

- the centrality of the sermon;
- the use of both traditional and timely prayers;
- the critical importance of music;
- a congregation invigorated by more young families, singles, and even local college students;
- consideration of a choice of times and types of services to appeal to a parish with different family and personal needs and schedules.

The Vestry is currently studying our recommendations and will create the final strategic plan for St. James. They will encourage your suggestions too, at stevethomas@live.com.

In the SPG's self-evaluation and research into other churches, we considered many ways to meet the needs of our parishioners and to attract new members. That said, we assert in our plan the primary importance of excellence – we can't do everything, but "anything worth doing is worth doing well" – and the historic character of our 300-year-old church. We must be true to ourselves.

### **2021 DIOCESAN CONVENTION RECAP**

Our Diocesan Convention was held virtually on Saturday, February 13. The usual two-day convention was condensed into a 3-hour zoom session. All efforts to make this happen produced a well-orchestrated, efficient experience and needed business was accomplished.

These include Florence Ellen Cowden, Commission on Ministry, Barbara Whitesides who will be extending her term due to situations brought on by the pandemic, Trinity Center Board of Managers, Cheryl Brainard and Steve Thomas, Executive Council, David Brownlow, Diocesan Foundation Board, Florence Ellen Cowden, and Ginny Woodruff, Racial Healing Commission, and Steve Thomas, Diocesan Finance Committee. Following are thoughts shared by Derrick Miller, who was one of our delegates.

"Like so many other events in this unusual time, the convention was mediated through Zoom, and somehow the organizers found a way to condense days of activities into just a few hours. Yet, there was a sense of joy and a feeling of togetherness in being there. (It was fun seeing familiar faces and names in the Zoom gallery!) The diocese appears to be in good health, especially considering the circumstances. A highlight of our time together was a video report on "Journey Through East Carolina," a project in which members of St. James participated. Seeing the images from across the diocese made it easy to forget for a few minutes that most of us were sitting at home watching on a screen. If virtual convention was that uplifting, I can only imagine what it will be like next year when delegates will finally be able to meet together again."

### SPIRITUAL GROWTH MOMENT: WAIT

Waiting can be full of energy and excitement. I've just ordered that coconut cake and my mouth is watering in anticipation. Or I'm standing by enthusiastically for the concert I've been looking forward to for months. My most wonderful waiting times (though they were not without anxiety) were when we were waiting for the births of our daughters.

But sometimes waiting is just difficult. Sometimes there is real need, and my hands are tied. I have done what I know to do, but my loved one still needs help in a crisis, or a job, or release from pain, or relief from isolation. I pray for God's provision, but little or nothing happens. At least, not that I can see. And so my waiting becomes a dark stillness in my soul.

In this Lenten season, I find myself thinking about a certain Sabbath waiting of Jesus' disciples. The women, waiting in grief for daybreak and wondering how they will deal with the heavy stone. The eleven, waiting in fear of a leaderless future. We know what is coming for them. We know that the stone will be rolled away, and the Risen Lord will appear in their midst. They will be surprised by the victory of Love and Life.

Lord, remind me that I am yours: body, mind, and soul. Nudge me to use waiting time to nourish all three, and fill my darkened spirit with Easter anticipation.

### **CONFIRMATION 2021**

St. James is happy to announce that The Rt. Rev'd Robert Skirving, Bishop of the Diocese of East Carolina, will be at St. James on Sunday, May 2, 2021, to preach, celebrate the Holy Eucharist, and administer the Sacrament of Confirmation.

The Book of Common Prayer states that, "Confirmation is the rite in which we express a mature commitment to Christ and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop." (p. 860).

In Confirmation, baptized persons are "confirmed" in the Christian faith with a laying on of hands by a bishop. Reception is a way for adults who have been confirmed by a bishop in the Roman Catholic, Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, or Eastern Orthodox Church to be received into the Episcopal Church by a bishop. The bishop does not lay hands on them but receives them into the church. Adults wishing to be confirmed/received or who may have questions are asked to contact The Rev'd Chris Hamby at chris@stjamesp.org.

With the support of the Clergy and Vestry, Confirmation for our young people will mark a change beginning this year. To help ensure that the candidates are making a mature and independent affirmation of their faith, we ask that young people who desire to be confirmed be a sophomore in high school or older. The commitment made during this very special sacrament is one that must be made with a clear understanding of what it means to continually dedicate each day to living the Christian faith and growing in love of God and neighbor. We want to encourage and empower our young people to explore ways that their Christian commitment can be lived through an intentional and thoughtful approach to Confirmation. The formation of a Christian takes time and should never be rushed.
