# Vestry Corner

From the Vestry:

We are grateful to come to you with news of a wonderful vestry retreat that was held in mid-January. We stayed in town and are so grateful to many spouses who supported us throughout the weekend, especially at mealtimes.

First, we were able to unanimously pass our 2022 budget - a balanced budget to the great efforts of the stewardship committee and our parish family! Just for reference and with appreciation for all who made it possible, we entered the year 2021 with a deficit "faith" budget (~\$34,000) and ended up - with deep gratitude - coming out positive (\$48,000). This end of year surplus is helpful as our roof replacement ended up costing more than initially quoted due to additional repairs needed. Also, your pledges allowed us to once again generously support increasing amounts of Outreach efforts in our community and World.

On Friday night we shared in a mutual ministry review with Rev. Phillip Craig, Jr. Before the retreat, each vestry member was asked to provide feedback of different ministries of St. James Parish in addition to our work as a vestry and with Phillip. Phillip presented to the vestry the results of the review in the most thoughtful and inspiring way. Not surprisingly, the feedback was positive and enthusiastic for the energy of St. James Parish and Phillip! There was constructive feedback and ideas for how to move St. James forward as we navigate coming back together under one roof. We are all so grateful for Phillip's servant-hearted leadership, openness to feedback and humble nature.

On Saturday we started out with a great presentation from Cheryl about Labyrinths and then had our own experience in Perry Hall with the beautiful Labyrinth which Cookie and Wes Clewis prayed down for us. It was a centering, prayerful experience and we hope all of you take advantage of any opportunity you have to experience the prayer and thoughtfulness that a Labyrinth experience includes. We continued the day with meaningful conversations about our Strategic Plan. We discussed the Sunday morning experience, the importance of Faith Formation, how to use our campus more and how to best empower leaders. We had a conversation about learning more about and leaning into our role in racial reconciliation in our community. We reviewed the commissions, the great work they are doing and how best to support them. The end of the day finished with affirmation of the meaningful and hard work of the St. James Clergy and staff and our desire as a vestry to support their great work!

### **HELP HUB UPDATE**

The Help Hub at the Harrelson Center is one of the major outreach ministries supported by St. James Parish, a Help Hub founding member. The Help Hub serves people in need by providing emergency financial assistance, and by offering referrals to Harrelson Center partners and other available community resources. In addition to financial assistance from St. James, a number of St. James parishioners regularly volunteer to serve as greeters, advisors, and data entry assistants; and Sonja McFarland, a St. James parishioner, serves as the director of the Help Hub.

The new year is off to a busy start at the Help Hub, with 129 individuals seeking help in the first two weeks. At the rate of over 20 per day, folks in need came to the Help Hub to meet with volunteer advisors who listen, assess, and determine ways to deal with various emergency situations. Restrictions on eviction and utility disconnections have been removed, and government relief funds and child tax credit payments have ended, resulting in more precarious situations for Help Hub clients. The Help Hub expects the high volume to continue, and hours have been extended in order to complete follow-up calls and data entry.

A new staff member, Alisa Brightman, was added in November to assist with the increasing needs at the Help Hub, particularly with the Help Hub's new assignment to secure housing and essential utility connections for high-risk Medicaid beneficiaries. The Help Hub is one of 54 organizations selected to serve in the Healthy Opportunities Pilot Program.

For the year 2021, the Help Hub assisted 1,106 individuals, with an average funding of \$228 per person, all totaling nearly \$250,000. For medical concerns, 25% of our visitors requested referral to our health care navigator, Dania Josey, who assisted with arranging prescriptions, medical equipment, eyeglasses and dental care. In addition to funding from supporting members of the Help Hub, such as St. James, funding assistance during 2021 was also received from the Champion McDowell Davis Charitable Foundation, the Catherine Kennedy Home Foundation, and the Hope Community Church. The Help Hub is continuing to file applications for additional funding grants.

Sadly, one of the Help Hub's most dedicated volunteers, Charlotte Murchison, passed away recently. She was a parishioner at St. James and was named the Harrelson Center Volunteer of the Year in 2017. This award recognized Charlotte's deep commitment to the Help Hub, and her compassionate attention to each person whom she counseled, making them feel heard and loved. Thank-you notes received at the Help Hub often expressed appreciation specifically for Charlotte, and for her kindness towards each individual. She will be greatly missed.

The Help Hub is very appreciative of the dedicated volunteers from St. James, and for the funding assistance provided by St. James Parish.
