### CONNECTION MINISTRY

One day, my 91 year-old mother, who has 2 computers, an iPad, and wears an iPhone on her belt, said, “I sure am glad I lived long enough to play with all these toys.” On days when I have experienced zoom-fatigue, zoom-neck, inbox overload and virtual exhaustion, it still thrills my soul to see her join St. James for Morning Prayer each day from South Carolina.

Even as we enter the 11th month of the new season of Covidtide, the Church is still strong folks – and I’m not talking about the buildings. ## **A STRATEGIC PLANNING GROUP UPDATE**

From November 6, 2019 to June 20, 2020 a Strategic Planning Group of fifteen men and women met to create a vision for Saint James Parish in anticipation of our search for a new rector.

Now, with the endorsement of the Vestry, our group is assured that we have faithfully and prayerfully prepared a far-sighted, ambitious plan for Saint James that is fully compatible with its rich, nearly 300-year history and tradition and its aspirations for the future.

Soon, members of the SPG will explain the Strategic Plan in six short videos devoted to a general introduction and each of the five strategies. In all, our Mission and Vision Statements and five strategies inform a simple Objective: "Over the next three years, St. James Church will increase its capacity for ministry by growing its resources (people, money, and use of campus) to serve the people of the congregation and the greater Wilmington Community."

With more detail – and plenty of enthusiasm – we will in these six videos tell you more about the future of St. James, and then in a Zoom session open to all members of the parish, we will answer questions about it. ### **THE REV'D MICHAEL SINGER'S COVID UPDATE**

Dear Friends,

I pray this letter finds you and your loved ones well. My reason for writing you currently is regarding St. James' response to COVID-19.

You may be aware that we currently are not meeting in the church for worship, and by order of the Governor there can be no meetings of greater than 10 people on church property.

Since 1729, St. James has been a place where people have gathered for public worship. We have come together on joyous occasions to celebrate joyous occasions such as baptisms, weddings, for Christmas, Easter, listen to music, for youth events, the list goes on and on. There have been times we have been able to comfort one another and share our grief ... for national disasters like 9/11, when we have gone to war, for funerals. St. James has been a safe place, a special place, a sacred place, and it will continue to be our sacred space. But, since April 2020, we have not been able to gather in that holy place due to COVID restrictions.

Some have stated, "Other churches are worshipping indoors, why can't we?" The churches of which you speak are also experiencing cases of COVID. You will not hear this reported on the evening news or in their church bulletins. It is happening. We all know of individuals who have/had COVID and unfortunately, we all know people who have died from COVID. Honestly, we are currently not meeting inside because I do not want to do your funeral. Simply put, the experts tell us.... it is just not safe.

We are blessed to have Mt. Lebanon Chapel and the lawn at St. James' downtown campus where we can currently meet outside on Sundays safely. Working in these conditions is more work for the parish staff than if we could just open the doors. There is nothing I or the parish staff would like to do more than to worship indoors at St. James.

Being people of hope, we pray that we soon will be able to gather in St. James. There is light at the end of the tunnel. The light is getting brighter every day. Until such time...wear your mask.... practice social distancing .... wash your hands and get the vaccine when it is available.
