SPIRITUAL GROWTH MOMENT: LIFE, LIVE IT

Philippians 4:6-7- *Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God.*

A couple weeks ago I attended my first Happening. For those of you who don't know what Happening is, it is a youth-led retreat at Trinity center that has been around for a long time. The retreat has many special traditions and I'm so glad I went. It was a church camp experience like no other. While there were many moving experiences at Happening, I'll focus on the one that led me to my title for this article: Life, Live it. Some of you may know about the title, but for those who don't, it is about Dr. Putt Browning and his daughter. The daughter, A.C., had a condition called epilepsy. Around 7 months ago, she passed away unexpectedly at the age of 16. When I arrived at this year's Happening, I saw Dr. Browning there and realized that he was a candidate like me. I think his presence changed the experience for me and everyone there. In one group activity, we did skits on life experiences and I would say his group's skit was pretty profound. It started out with him yelling to God about how he could have taken someone like his daughter from him, and then giving an emotion riddled speech about A.C. that rocked everyone there to the core. One word frequently mentioned in the skit was "why?" I'm sure everyone has questions like that in their life. What sense does it make that God would let bad things happen to good people? We may never know, but what we do know is that he uses them to strengthen us, make us grateful for the things we have, impact the community around us and bind us together. Now I didn't know A.C. very well, but one thing I heard about her is that she wouldn't let her condition take away from the joy she had in her life. I think that this story fits so well with the current situation we are in, with COVID-19. I think people need to stay diligent about keeping safe and not spreading the virus, but we cannot let something like this consume us. We have to trust God's plan through all of this and know that he will prevail. In a situation like this where we don't have control over what will happen, we just have to live life and take pleasure in the simple things. Having more time at home like this allows us to have more time for prayer, thanksgiving and quiet time which is something I know I definitely need to work on. So in this time of uncertainty, think back to these few words: Life, Live it.

ST JAMES YOUTH CONFIRMATION 2020

Each year the St. James young people are invited to learn more about the history, the beliefs and the traditions of The Episcopal Church, about the St James Parish, and about the process of preparation that occurs as one journeys on the path toward CONFIRMATION. Through education, experiences, relationships and group gatherings, our young people on this faith journey discern if and “when they are ready and have duly prepared, to make a mature public affirmation of their faith and commitment to the responsibilities of their Baptism and to receive the laying on of hands by the bishop” BCP p. 412. The journey towards Confirmation within The Episcopal Church is an exciting and meaningful experience where each young person decides if they are ready to take responsibility for their journey of faith within The Episcopal Church. The Confirmation process and education seeks to create an environment where an authentic Christian community can be formed and all parts of our liturgies, traditions, history, and faith formation can be studied and questions can be asked. It was our hope that this year, our young people participating in the 2020 Confirmation Process would participate in an “active learning style” of education. Each person would experience the depth of our Episcopal Traditions and also have the freedom to ask questions and perhaps “struggle” and “question” why we believe what we believe and what our worship means within our lives.

Several unavoidable circumstances and events have disrupted the 2020 Youth Confirmation Educational Experience. Since we do not have a clear sense of what the next weeks and months might bring, the Confirmation Formation Process of our young people will be offered during the 2020-2021 Academic Year. Many Episcopal Churches are encouraging young people to wait to go through the Confirmation Process until they are in high school or even later. It is important for us to remember that during the Sacrament of Holy Baptism, “you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ’s own for ever.” During Confirmation, the candidate reaffirms the renunciation of evil, renews their commitment to Jesus Christ and with God’s grace, they promise to follow Jesus Christ as their Savior and Lord. The congregation prays “for these people who have renewed their commitment to Christ.” BCP p. 417 St. James is extremely committed to the journey of faith that our young people are experiencing and we will gladly and authentically accompany each of them on their journeys of faith.
