Dear Parish Family,

The poet T.S. Eliott once wrote, "April is the cruelest month." Unfortunate for him not to experience the past month here at St. James! Indeed, our worship, gatherings and celebrations filled the season. We have so much for which to be grateful.

St. James entered April with a full house combined 10:30 am service on Palm Sunday. The palm procession made quite a visible statement to Third Street travelers that morning, and the Passion Narrative - complete with voices across our congregation - set a good context for the Holy Week to come. Noon day Eucharists through the week kept the sacred timeline moving forward until Maundy Thursday evening. That worship, complete with a traditional footwashing and the stripping of our altar, created a beautiful tone for the three days to follow.

Good Friday was a sunny day, as we gathered for Stations of the Cross at our beautiful Mount Lebanon Chapel. The new handmade banners were an extraordinary addition to the occasion, which finished with worship inside the Chapel. Our downtown Easter Vigil on Saturday evening, complete with a baptism, allowed for our first celebration of the risen Christ.

Easter was a joy. Well over 800 people filled our pews across five services to praise God with abounding alleluias for the foundational moment of our faith. Our sanctuary was absolutely beautiful. May I offer thanks to all those who contributed with their hands and hearts of love for our Easter celebrations.

April also witnessed our youth creating Easter baskets for children at Episcopal Farmworkers Ministry. We launched twenty-four people to experience and witness the beauty of the Holy Land, and sent nine Men on Missioners to offer tangible support to our friends at Glory Ridge in Madison County.

Bishop Rob joined us on the afternoon of April 23rd, as eighteen adults made their commitment (or recommitment) to Christ, through baptism, confirmation, reception and reaffirmation. Here was another meaningful reflection of hope for our parish family.

In and among the days of April, we gathered in our sanctuary to celebrate many lives well lived. We came together in small groups to share a meal, or to learn more fully about our neighbors here in Wilmington, or to reflect on shared experiences of grief, or to discuss racial reconciliation. Our smaller group gatherings are powerful ways for us to build community..

How beautiful that on the very last day of April, our Evangelism Commission provided a welcome luncheon in the Great Hall for over twenty five newcomers to our parish family. Thank you Evangelism Commission!

With April behind us, we move forward with great momentum for the seasons to come. I remain grateful to serve as your Rector, and to share in this vibrant and joyful community of Christ.

"He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: 'The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.'" -Luke 24:6-7

The preparation for Holy Week and Easter is long, as it should be. Lent prepares us to receive the Resurrection. Now we move forward with thanksgiving. A small group of MoM just returned from Glory Ridge. The goal was to help prepare the grounds for the upcoming summer youth group missions. Glory Ridge is a multi-denominational Christian camp in western North Carolina that emphasizes a combination of service work and worship. We at SJP are so fortunate to have access to Glory Ridge and Trinity Center. In serving others, we serve ourselves.

The SJP Outreach Committee met last month with the Vestry. As a member of St. James, you can be proud of how far your service to others extends. When parishioners present opportunities, the Committee responds. Areas of past support continue. This year's Outreach assistance has been expanded to Eden Village "tiny" homes, the Northside Grocery Cooperative, 2Share, and additional funding for Rise Against Hunger. Each month in the Grapevine there is a spotlight on an Outreach organization, look for opportunities to share your time and talents. The extent of Outreach service is only limited by the amount of funds available.

Which brings us to another service opportunity. Cape Fear Habitat for Humanity is organizing a "Unity Build" for next Fall to address the critical need for affordable housing in this region. The Build will consist of two new homes located in Castle Hayne. St. James along with 10 other churches has been asked to be involved. The fundraising goal for the two homes is \$90,000.00. 

WHERE DO FUNDS RAISED GO? ST. JAMES YOUTH OUTREACH

Our St. James young people are committed to worship in action! Along with their friends and adults who accompany our young people on their journeys of faith, our St. James Youth take on several outreach and service projects during the year. This summer many of our young people will be serving God through Outreach & Mission.

During 2023 - 2024, our young people will be working on projects locally, domestically, and abroad. Earlier this year, our youth collected over 300 stuffed animals to give to children of refugees, built over 130 Easter baskets for children of migrant farmworkers, and have begun to sign up for summer mission experiences!

"Glory Ridge" in Madison County will be our weeklong outreach opportunity where we will repair homes, begin to build a home for one of the families for whom we have worked whose home burned to the ground a little over a month ago.

In July, fifteen of us will fly to Ecuador to repair, build, share, learn and worship with our new Ecuadorian friends and we will learn about their history and culture. Historically, St. James has been a leader in helping people who have need that can be met by our gifts and talents.

During the coming year, our youth will be experiencing Episcopal worship in a variety of traditions and cultures, providing Bible School for children, and renovating and building homes, schools, and churches. As a result of our activities we hope to come away with a keener sense of God at work in us both here in Wilmington and in the world.
