WHO ARE WE?

I've been fortunate to visit some of the great churches in the United States and Western Europe. Each time I walk through a church door, I am mindful of those who have entered these doors before. I think of those who the world might think of as prestigious, the dignitaries of government and church, but I most often think of those whom the world may think of as ordinary.

I have in my mind a picture of the elderly couple helping each other climb the few steps leading to the main church door. He works so hard to do it by himself, she tries not to lean too heavily on him—but both realize they need each other to accomplish what seems to be a monumental task of opening the church door. Or there is the family; mother, and father with three children. Dad is carrying the smallest child. The oldest is a daughter, on the verge of adulthood, with her head hung down, arms crossed, thinking this is the last place she wants to be. There is the young couple, smiles beaming across their faces as they think how beautiful their wedding day will be in a couple of weeks. They almost bounce up the steps.

Lastly, there is a man of 45, who looks much older, this is because he has been struggling with alcoholism for so many years he can't remember. His addiction has cost him his family, his friends, his job. The only thing he has left is the love of God he has learned of in recovery. He admits he is powerless over alcohol; he has come to believe that a Power is greater than himself and he has made the decision to turn his will and life over to the

care of God. His practice of coming to church for regular weekly worship is the only way he can see to connect with God.

Christian community can be found in many forms and in many places. The Monday of Easter Week I returned to Mt. Lebanon Chapel to retrieve something I left at the Easter Vigil. The area around the chapel was surrounded by visitors. There was a young family I met and began talking with. Parents with two children. They mentioned they had visited the place often and always wanted to go inside. I took the time to retrieve what I needed and let them look around. I took a photo of them inside. Since the doors were open, others began to enter. There was an older woman, by herself, who walked up to the altar rail, bowed her head, as to say a prayer, and then left. What was supposed to be a brief retrieval ended up being a longer stay than I expected. They were pilgrims on a journey.

Over the months of my time here at St. James, I've spent the first three months worshipping outdoors at Mt. Lebanon Chapel. Some Sunday mornings were cold, and others were really cold, with wind and possibly a light rain. But I try to imagine what it must have been like in the 1830's, when the chapel was first built, as worshippers gathered in all kinds of weather at a place where they experienced community and God. At the time Mt. Lebanon first opened, the area surrounding would have been largely unsettled, very different than it is today.

During COVID, whether it was Faith at 5, or Worship at 4; groups of worshippers, primarily young people, have gathered on the front lawn of St. James or at Mt. Lebanon Chapel, again for Christian community and to worship God.

Although not perfect, and in one fashion or another, the church has always been around, worshipping in a variety of places by all sorts and conditions of people. I believe the church will always be around, in one fashion or another...at least until the day when Jesus returns.

I have profoundly enjoyed my brief time with you. It is near time for me to leave. I thank the wardens and vestry

ST. JAMES STRATEGIC PLAN ~ CONCLUSION

The Strategic Planning Group has now shared with members of St. James Parish the recommendations we have offered to the Vestry, strategies which call upon us all to fulfill anew the historic mission of our nearly 300-year-old church – arguably one of the great old churches in America.

We have called upon our parish to “seek excellence”; to “seize the moment” of opportunity; and, importantly, “to be true to ourselves,” not a copy of another church.

We believe that these strategies are true to our historic mission:

- energized worship
- enhanced ministries
- fully utilized campus
- increased financial support
- sincere welcome for others to join us.

We believe too that these strategies call for growth, not for change. CS Lewis reminds us of the difference: “Change is not progress unless the core remains unchanged. A small oak grows into a big oak: if it became a beech, that would not be growth, but mere change.” Our “core” is solid, and from it Saint James will grow.

We who worship at a great old church or, say, attend a great old college or university understand that with their history and traditions they are grounded in paradox: We want them to be excellent, real leaders – at the same time that we want them to be exactly the way they have always been.

We understand that. And we believe we can preserve the historic mission and values of St. James and still be ambitious for its future. With God’s will and hard work, we can do both.
