

From the Rector

Dear Parish Family,

What an inspiring joy it was to experience my first Holy Week and Easter Sunday here at St. James Parish. My thanks to all of you who participated in such meaningful and significant ways over the course of the week. Easter Sunday was truly exceptional, both in beauty and in the manner by which we

celebrated the extraordinary gift of Christ's grace and love. As our newest Third Street banner so rightly claims: "Alleluia! Jesus Christ is Risen!"

For me, this season of gratitude also has included the tremendous opportunity to spend time with many of our youth, as we prepared together for Confirmation Sunday on May 1st. Education for Ministry

FOUR ST. JAMES PARISHIONERS COMPLETE EFM PROGRAM.

The Wednesday Evening Education for Ministry (EfM) group at St. James is pleased to announce that four of our members have completed the four-year EfM program. On May 18, at the final meeting of our 2021 – 2022 EfM program year, Claudia Brown, Bill Brown, Jim McFarland, and John Sullivan will receive a Certificate of Completion from the School of Theology of the University of the South in Sewanee, Tennessee, in recognition of their fine accomplishments.

FROM OUR 'GRADUATING' MEMBERS:

Bill and Claudia Brown: Seeking God's direction for our lives, four years ago Claudia and I entered into a program that would guide us along a path to increase and strengthen our knowledge of God's plan for both of us. Fortunately for us a program that suits this exact purpose was and is available at St. James. We joined one of two EFM groups at St. James and began this wonderful and informative four-year journey. The course curriculum covers theology, the Bible, and Christian history, and it includes a number of books by authors offering varied opinions concerning Christianity. Of course, the very important key to the success of this study effort is the two wonderful mentors, Bill Bivins and Karen Clark, who weekly guide the learning process. They are both dedicated believers who faithfully commit themselves to the success of the group's members. Sharing this experience with the members of our group has been wonderful and at the same time a blessing. EFM has been a lifechanging experience for us, and what we have learned and experienced through these four years will stay with us for the rest of our lives. Our studies will be an everlasting reward for both of us.

John Sullivan: When I first embarked on my Education for Ministry journey, it was made clear that there would be a considerable amount of coursework in the form of weekly readings. This proved to be abundantly true, as the course includes reading the Bible over the course of two years, a third year that consisted of reading about the entire history of Christianity, and the final year included examining various aspects of theology. While this initially seemed quite onerous and made me hesitant to join, I soon discovered that it was a journey that I was not taking alone.

Each of the four levels within each EfM group travels a bit of a "sub-journey" together with intense study of that year's material, but the entire group journeys together as we learn about what other year students are studying. The group also grows together through prayer, reflection, discussion, and group exercises in theological reflection. It is bittersweet at the end of each year when fourth-year folks graduate and leave the group, yet there are new horizons as new first-year folks join in September.

A friend of mine who is not a St. James parishioner took EfM some 20 years ago with a group at St. James, and he said that some 20 years on, members of his EfM group still get together—the bonds that are created are just that strong and enduring. I have that sense myself with those with whom I have sojourned in EfM. (Another friend reviews books for publication, and he ends each review with a concise thumbs-up or thumbs-down, and in my case with EfM, I highly recommend it.)

WHAT IS EfM?

EfM is a four-year program which includes indepth study of the Old Testament (Year 1), the New Testament (Year 2), Christian history (Year 3), and Christian ethics and theology (Year 4). EfM provides opportunities for prayer, worship, study, and spiritual reflection in a comfortable and supportive group setting which fosters spiritual growth and helps participants to more deeply connect their faith with their daily lives. As Christians, we are called to be active participants in the church's ministry. EfM helps each participant to identify the call in their own lives, and to discern how to carry out their ministries within the parish and beyond.

The Wednesday evening EfM program at St. James, mentored by Karen Clark and Bill Bivins, is one of two EfM programs offered at St. James. The other EfM program is offered on Tuesday mornings and is mentored by Rachel Pace.

Jim McFarland: Knowing that God is present in my life has always been easy for me. My earliest memories are of walking through the woods saying, "This is awesome, someone very smart built this." All my life I've been surrounded by very smart people, mostly doctors, who even though they were full of godly compassion, were not the ones who built this world. EFM has taught me that we all share many thoughts, doubts, fears, victories, and failures that take up much of our daily thought and routine. EFM has helped me to understand how God and his friendship are a softener of these thoughts, and how to place them in their proper perspective. Through God's teachings and presence, I can sense the truth which gives me the strength to act. EFM has helped most in teaching me that applying faith to action and ministry, is the most important area I need to work on. It is the most difficult, especially in this day of constant condemnation, to realize that ministry through faith is the only thing that really matters. EFM taught me also that, like visiting with friends and family, visiting and spending time with God every day, multiple times a day, is necessary to the long-term health of the relationship. It is also necessary for your own sanity, a duality that smooths life's bumps and bruises and is Gods greatest gift. EFM has also refreshed my memory of the value of good teachers and that teaching is comprised mostly of tolerance, understanding, and acceptance of all perspectives.

ST. JAMES HISTORIC GRAVEYARD UPDATE

RARE DOMED VAULTS SAVED BY A GENEROUS GIFT FROM THE ORTON FOUNDATION

Our historic graveyard has four unique brick burial vaults. In earlier days there were more, but as buildings filled the sacred acre, they were lost. Such vaults are mostly found in coastal cemeteries. They were only for the affluent, as they are made of imported handmade bricks and required a skilled mason to construct. They have walls and floors 7-8 feet deep, able to accommodate many deceased, originally on shelves.

The Orton Foundation sent cemetery conservators to examine our graves for structural integrity. Their archeological report recommended restoration methods, a source for the mortar required, and craftsmen competent to do such specialized work. They shared their knowledge of vault interiors and how they were used.

Three of our vaults are joined by retaining walls. They have no dates nor inscriptions. It is not known who is buried in them. Fortunately, the single one is dated 1786 and inscribed "Henry Toomer and Charles Jewkes' Family Vault. (See the graveyard history on our website.) St. James Parish is deeply grateful to the Orton Foundation for preserving our domed graves, ensuring they will last into the next century.


