Dear Parish Family,

This past Wednesday evening we embarked on a five-week program endeavor, with the hopes of welcoming and gathering parishioners of all ages. At the front of the evening was children's choir practice (look for their Sunday anthem in early November). The latter part of the evening was both adult choir practice and my offering of a group book study. The wonderful heart of this evening was a shared meal in the Great Hall. The food was delicious, the room was full and the conversation was terrific. On Sunday, we saw the amazing return of the tradition of breakfast in the Great Hall. Again, there was a tremendous and enthusiastic turnout. Both events were a beautiful reminder of how much we gain as a community when we are simply together to share a meal.

Back to the Wednesday book study - Brian Stevenson is a public interest lawyer who has dedicated his career to helping the poor, the incarcerated, and the condemned. His book *Just Mercy* is a compelling account of his perspectives. Early in his book, Stevenson fondly recalls his relationship with his grandmother, who always pulled him in for long hugs and reminded him to "stay close." That experience informed the compassion he brought to his personal and professional life, and led him in his narrative to emphasize the critical value of "proximity." He argues that there is no way for any of us to fully understand the value and dignity of other human beings without a willingness to come close and be in their presence.

Among the many learnings from our COVID experience, we now see more fully and can be grateful for the gift of "proximity" in our parish life together. I don't for a minute take that for granted when we gather for worship on a Sunday morning, and importantly have Eucharist together. After all, in doing so we are recalling and modeling a particular moment in time, when Jesus gathered his closest of friends, and shared a meal with them.

Blessings for the year to come.

With the weather change also comes a bittersweet change in our church as we say farewell to summer Sunday mornings at Mount Lebanon Chapel and join together again at the downtown campus for worship and formation. In this issue's Vestry "Spotlight", we would like to share appreciation for the St. James Finance Committee. This group of 10 meets at least monthly and spends hours in discernment of how God is best leading us to utilize the resources so faithfully given by our parishioners. We review financial statements, consider potential decisions that involve money, and do the heavy-lifting each year around crafting a draft budget for Vestry consideration. We specifically want to lift up our amazing Financial Administrator, Maria Hollopeter, and our Parish Treasurer, Mike Brown. These two individuals spend multiple hours each week making sure that every dime trusted to St. James is utilized to His glory as it should be. Thank you, Mike & Maria!!

Finally, a note of recognition and thanks goes out to our dear parishioner, Peg Rorison. While we were enduring the impact of COVID and were unable to gather together downtown for worship (among many other hardships), the real & critical need for Livestream filming and broadcast of our services came to the foreground. Peg stepped forward and made a very generous gift to the church which enabled the installation of our state-of-the-art technology that has made it possible for many to worship with others on Sunday mornings. The camera installed is very high-resolution and the sound feed is directly from our professional microphones, so it is very easy to hear everything clearly. If you have not had a chance to experience one of our live feed services, we encourage you to do so if you ever find yourself unable to physically join us for worship for any reason. From all of us at St. James, thank you, Peg!!

Thoughts from the Clergy

Do you ever wonder where your prayers go? Does God have a huge computer keeping them all in order with columns for “yes, no, maybe later”? Although it can be amusing to daydream about such or to think of our prayers as portrayed by Hollywood in old movies, such as Evan or Bruce Almighty. Fun as these are to watch, we know that Jesus prayed to God Almighty and left us with good examples regarding how and where to pray.

The “formula” we use most often is our Lord’s Prayer, which is worth a deeper dive and one I hope to offer a study on soon. In Jesus’ prayers, he most often begins with recognition of who God is and a thank you. Regarding where Jesus prayed, he frequently escaped to solitary places such as mountain tops, and of course, we find him praying in the garden before his death. But other times, he simply looked up and spoke, such as before he raised Lazarus from the dead (John 11:41-42).

We do not have a record of where Jesus wrote anything, but I still would like to know what he wrote in the sand with his finger upon forgiving the woman caught in adultery (John 8:6). Was that a prayer?

Literally, for the past 25 years, with the earliest from 1997, I have been writing my prayers in journals. Every time we move, the boxes multiply. Unfortunately, most would find them boring. Many pages are filled with complaints about situations, begging for quick answers, and asking forgiveness for the same things over and over. But occasionally, I come across a nugget of where I had agonized over a situation only to see later how God had faithfully been present with me in my distress and had answered, even if not in a perfect “yes, no, or maybe later” fashion.

If you have never tried writing your prayers, I encourage you to do so and let your pen flow. It really is amazing to have a record of transformation and of God’s working in your life even when perhaps you doubted that Presence most. But looking up and simply saying, “Help” works just as well. Give it a try today.

CONFIDENTIAL PRAYER TEAM

Are any among you suffering? They should pray. Are any cheerful? They should sing songs of praise. Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up; and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven (James 5:13-15).

Did you know there is a confidential prayer team at St James? These are committed women and men who devote a portion of their day to pray for the many needs of St. James. Whether you are headed to the hospital for surgery, suffering from a long-term illness or having struggles at home, we invite you to not go it alone. Let your St. James family assist you.

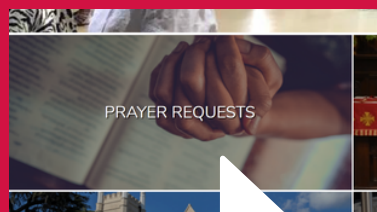

For others, or if your request is of a more sensitive nature, there is a box to check “for clergy and confidential prayer team only.” You choose whichever is best for you.

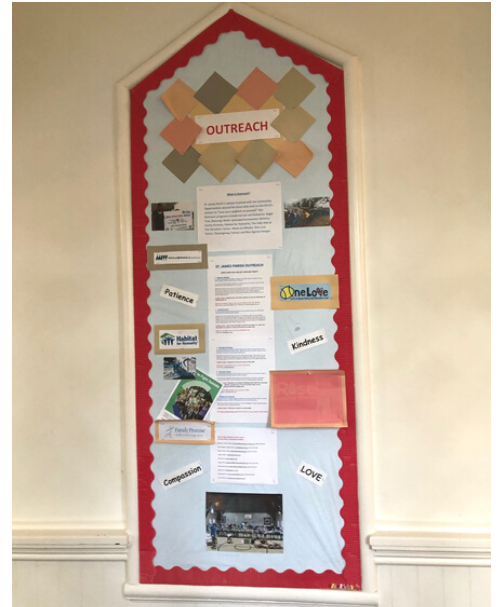

ST. JAMES MEAL PACKING EVENT 2022 TOGETHER, WE PACKED OVER 50,000 MEALS

Thank you to the 230+ volunteers who supported St. James Outreach's partnership with Rise Against Hunger just a few weeks ago! A large moving truck arrived in our parking lot just before 8:00am on 24 September, and Men on a Mission (plus several women and young folks!) worked to unload about a dozen pallets of dry goods and set-up Perry Hall as volunteers began to arrive. Around 9:00am Don Brainard welcomed everyone and recognized the other churches and community partners who had signed up to volunteer alongside us. Phillip opened with prayer and two Rise Against Hunger staffers told us about their organizational mission, then explained the assembly lines and different roles volunteers would undertake throughout the morning.

From 9:00am until noon, we worked in stations to build meal kits, each containing soy, dehydrated vegetables, rice, and vitamins. At the next station the kits were weighed for precision and sealed before going on to finally be packaged in boxes of 36. These boxes were loaded back onto the moving truck and will be shipped to destinations such as Haiti, the Dominican Republic, and Nicaragua. There, Rise Against Hunger and its partner organizations will distribute them to locals experiencing hunger and food insecurity.

In total, we made enough kits to package 50,000 meals—all over the course of one Saturday morning! We are so glad this partnership has become an annual fixture at St. James. Thank you to our Youth for originally bringing the partnership to our church, and for continuing to be a major player in volunteer recruitment over the years. It was wonderful to see folks ranging in age from Day School students to nonagenarians working side by side to serve others. We're also grateful for the participation of community partners, including St. Paul's Episcopal Church, First Presbyterian, Spiritual Soul Center, Warner Temple AME Church, Spiritual Educational Outreach Ministries, and New Hanover Regional Medical Center.

CHRISMONS - A CREATIVE MINISTRY



Looking to be a part of a creative ministry? Consider crafting Chrismons! We have several dedicated artists who offer their time to make lovely handmade Chrismons for our parish family.

What is a Chrismon? A Chrismon is an ornament with intention, most typically used during the season of Advent. "Chrismon" is the culmination of two words, Chris(t) and mon(ogram), because Christmas is the birthday of the Christ Child. The Chrismon tree decorations were made to honor Him on His birthday. This custom began in 1957 in a Lutheran church in Virginia. All Chrismons are made of white and gold. The white refers to our Lord's purity; the gold, to His Majesty.

Chrismons may be made with any material, and by any technique such as cross stitch, needlepoint, or gold and white beads, with wire.

Chrismons are made with love and to the glory of God. As a reflection of God's grace, Chrismons are made as a gift and are not meant to be bought or sold. At St. James, Chrismons are given to families to celebrate special moments, like a new family member, baptism, or marriage.

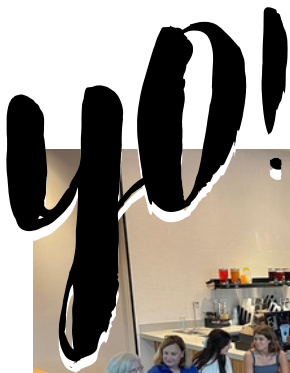
