The Need

In New Hanover County

HOMEOWNERSHIP PROGRAM



Building homes, communities and hope



Applicants must

- Live or work in New Hanover, Duplin or Pender County
- Demonstrate a need in one of three areas:
 - Live in overcrowded or unsafe conditions
 - Live in subsidized housing
 - Live in substandard housing or are homeless
 - Housing cost greater than 30% of income
 - Unable to get a home loan from any source



Applicants must

- Have a stable income
- Be able to pay a modest, monthly mortgage
- Contribute 250-400 hours of "sweat equity"
- Pay closing costs and monthly affordable mortgage payments – no more than 30% of household income




